## Introduction:

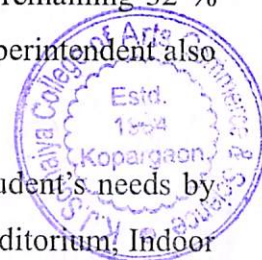
K. J. Somaiya College of Arts, Commerce & Science, Kopargaon is an institution managed by the Kopargaon Taluka Education Society, Kopargaon. Our college embodies the long-cherished dream of the people of Kopargaon, to have an institution of higher education for the children of farmers in the vicinity. The dream and the vision of our founders - who believed that the best service to humanity is done through Education. The college, established in 1964 is affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University, (Formerly known as Pune University) and aided by the Maharashtra Government. The location in a peaceful semi urban locality, the lush green lawns and well-designed infrastructure provide the perfect ambience for learning, sharing and holistic development of the students.

The college has witnessed benchmark changes in last few years. Some of the new academic programmes have been introduced for more exposure to students in their choices. 03 undergraduate programmes in Botany, Zoology and Mathematics with 03 PG programmes in M. C. A. Commerce, M.C.S and M. A. /M.Sc. Geography have started since last accreditation.

Twenty-two self-financed career-oriented certificate courses designed as per the local needs are offered to the students. These courses acted like touchstone, which created more opportunities for students to expand the sources for employability. It has also created circumstances to invite and interact with the experts from different disciplines, who share their knowledge and contributed in developing quality of teaching and learning. The college has promoted moral values of great legends by introducing certificate courses on Gandhian Thoughts and Dr. Ambedkar's Life and Work.

The college at present offers 16 undergraduate courses and 11 post graduate courses. The college has total student strength of 2357 comprising 1870 UG students and 487 PG students. The college has faculty strength of 80, of which 34 are permanent and 46 Contractual Teachers. 68 % of the Permanent faculty members are Ph. D holders, and remaining 32 % faculty members are on the verge of completion of Doctoral work. Office Superintendent also holds a Ph. D.

The College has expanded its infrastructure, keeping in mind the student's needs by providing them with I.C.T., Language Laboratory, Commerce Laboratory, auditorium, Indoor game hall with well-equipped badminton court and Gymnasium. The mentoring system has been introduced with due consideration of peer team report recommendation. The DST-FIST



scheme has contributed a lot to the laboratory development, renovation and granting major instruments with a grant of Rs.50,00,000/-. This all has definitely heightened the quality academic atmosphere of the college. The college has signed 11 MoU's with various academic institutions, industries, and social organizations. The NSS unit in last five years has adopted 02 villages "*Ghari and Dauch*" where various Government schemes were implemented. The Godavari River Bank beautification programme is under taken and it is appreciated by the society and media also.

The faculty of K. J. Somaiya College is committed to character building, developing skills and imparting knowledge. The advanced teaching learning methods are employed by the faculty members. The faculty is keen in providing academic, personal and career guidance to students. Students are encouraged to make use of ICT in the process of learning. The infrastructure and facilities available on the college are among the very best. The college has an exceptionally supportive management, parent association which helps the college scale new heights. The Alumnae continue to contribute to the growth of the college and take part in the welfare activities. The college gives importance to provide value and skill-based education.

For development of faculty, the institute organizes every year Seminar, Conferences, orientation programmes, one day workshops, for refurbishing their teaching-learning and also new research in their fields. This was possible only because of the support of administrative staff of the college. Even for them, the institute has organized orientation programmes for enhancing their capabilities. All faculty departments and administrative offices are connected with internet through lease line of 10 Mbps which makes them easy to connect and be updated with outside world. Nevertheless, the college always strives for quality sustenance and enhancement in higher education.

The college NCC &NSS units play an important role in character building, personality development and social upliftment. The institution upholds humanism and tolerance and helps the young generation to achieve confidence and "to raise oneself with the help of self" (*Uddhredatmanatmanam*) which is our guiding motto.

39. Recognized extension/ outreach work through issues like *Sree Sabalakaran (Women Empowerment)*, *K. B. Rohamare lecture series in Finance*, *Jagar Janiwancha*, *Cyber Security Cell*, *Environment Development Cell*, *Godavari River Project etc.*
40. Remarkable expansion of infrastructure and technology during the last five years by the management.

#### Weakness:

1. Government approved but still not sanctioned posts in the office staff. (at present the financial burden for substitute is with the management)
2. High student teacher ratio.
3. Limitation of space in Library building.
4. College in a rural area and lack of industry has posed limitations on collaborations and linkages.
5. Limited scope for resource generation from consultancy.
6. The need to increase the number of classrooms.
7. Inadequate financial support.

#### Opportunity:




1. Scope for resource generation from funding agencies other than the UGC & BCUD.
2. Scope for interdisciplinary research projects.
3. Scope for applied research (lab to land, writing of history, conducting surveys and translations.)
