2.12 How does IQAC Contribute/Monitor/Evaluate the Teaching & Learning processes:

- The IQAC recommends the yearly planning of tests, tutorials and Internal Examinations every year at the beginning of the year which results into the best performance of our students in university examinations.
- The Internal Examinations answer books are evaluated and the results are communicated to the students for their improvement.
- IQAC promotes and motivates the teachers to go for ICT based teaching. Three Smart Class Rooms are available for ICT based teaching.

- IQAC recommends class seminars, group discussions and paper presentations in the class by the students. This resulted into better overall performance of the students in general and stage daring and improved pronunciation in particular.
- IQAC analyses the results of all classes and give suggestions to the teachers for their improvement.
- Every year IQAC recommends Academic Audit of all the departments in which academic assessment takes place and some suggestions are given for the improvement. 'ISO 9001:2015 Surveillance Audit' helps in the assessment of all the departments.
- In this year also college initiated 'Green Audit' of our campus through IQAC by an external agency.
- This year also college conducted 'Energy Audit' of our campus through IQAC by Aditi Engineering Services, Nasik.
- IQAC interacts with all Heads of the Departments and discuss with them about their academic current status and future plans. IQAC gives some suggestions to each department. This mechanism helps the department to update their records like teaching diaries, roll call etc.
- IQAC plans and designs the budget for each department and accordingly budget is allocated to every department through which equipments are purchased.
- At the beginning of every year IQAC discusses with the librarian and the budget is planned to maintain ideal student-book ratio. The students from poor sections of society are provided books through Book-Bank facility by library.

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

Objectives:

- To introduce necessary short-term and long-term courses whenever necessary, in the light of the vision and mission of the institute.
- To provide opportunities to students and faculty to contribute to the social development and economic growth of the society.
- To inculcate the sense of discipline, environmental consciousness and human values among the students.
- To make continuous efforts for research promotion for improving teaching-learning process and the use of information technology.

6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System

i. Administrative procedures including finance:

The College Principal acts as facilitator between the governing body and the college staff. All the data concerning various processes is well maintained and principal retrieves data as per the requirements. All the financial transactions are also processed through installed software 'Vridhi' where it can be easily detected whether the funds allocated are properly utilized or not.

The data in admission includes important aspects such as salary maintenance of teaching & non-teaching and adhoc, balance sheet, PF/ pension, Recruitment procedure, Student admission, correspondence with university, DHE, UGC, Management & other external bodies, RTI correspondence, records maintenance & building maintenance etc.

ii. Student admissions: Information is provided through college website for online admissions of all classes.

iii. Student records:

- a) MIS- Management Information System: Basic information of the institution and the data concerning students, personal information, educational qualification, internal examination, performance, attendance records, hostel facility, scholarship information, facility for physically handicapped students and research activity etc. can be accessed through MIS which is maintained in the form of registers & on computers. MIS is very actively functional in our college. Top-down flow of information and bottom-up communication take place very effectively. MIS is active in three layer systems in our college- 1) Local/college level, 2) Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Maharashtra and 3) AISHE, Ministry of HRD, Delhi.
- b) <u>CMS</u>- College Management System- For this purpose administration office develops an office network. In this office computerisation the data concerning students, personal information, educational qualification, internal examination, performance, attendance records, hostel facility, scholarship information, facility for physically handicapped students and research activity etc. is maintained.
- i. *Evaluation and examination procedures:* Internal evaluation is done on the basis of class tests. The concern faculty transfers the data to the office and the in-charge of attendance. The office maintains a record using university guidelines. Controller of Examination is appointed as per the guidelines of University. In house first year examination of undergraduate course is conducted as per guidelines of S. P. Pune University. Hall tickets of all College and University Examination are provided to the students on college website, from where they can download.
- ii. **Research administration:** Records of project done by some undergraduate and postgraduate students is maintained in the concern department. A research committee is appointed to guide the faculty member in assisting their research documentations and solving their queries.
- iii. *Other:* For this purpose LAN has been developed and software '*Vridhi*' is installed and being used.
- 6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:
- 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The curriculum is designed and developed by Savitribai Phule Pune University and implemented by the college. However, the university arranges some workshops for the teachers while designing syllabus. Many of our teachers participate in these workshops every year and give their feedback to the Board of Studies, S. P. Pune University, Pune.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Preparation of Academic Calendar in the month of April.
- Time Table for all classes is set in the month of April.
- Teaching plans are prepared by all faculty members in April.
- The execution of time-table and teaching plan is done in the next academic year.
- ICT based teaching-learning is preferred by all faculty members.
- *Three Smart Classes* are developed which are used by all faculty members for ICT teaching.
- Film and Drama appreciation programmes are arranged in the form of screening of the play and films in college. Discussion is followed by screening.
- Class seminars and group discussions are arranged by all faculty members in their respective subjects.
- Techno-Fests and PPT competitions are organized in several departments.
- Expert lecture series is organized every year in each department.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Internal squad, CCTV surveillance, separate examination office with computer, broad band internet, and Xerox copier facility is provided in the college. Computerized results are generated by using 'Vriddhi' software.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- The office bearers of Kopargaon Taluka Education society management and the Principal always promote research in college by motivating teachers to apply for major and minor research projects. 04 Minor Research Project were completed during this year. The Principal also motivated the staff to register for Ph. D. This year 01 Ph. D. degrees awarded to faculty.
- Four students participated in 'Avishkar-2017' and they were honoured by the University with certificates.
- This year college organized 'Convocation Ceremony' at college level to award Degree
 Certificate to the students who completed their under graduation from our college.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- Library is well equipped with the OPAC system. The library uses INFLIBNET, database and also has online membership of prestigious institution like British Council Library.
- The college also makes the use of ICT in teaching, learning and evaluation.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- IQAC monitors the utilization of human resources in the best possible way.
- Technical support and training is provided to them in college campuses as well as they are sent to participate in training programme organized by other institutes/universities.
- All the staff members of teaching and non-teaching faculty are encouraged for the best performance by appreciating their achievements.
- Kaizen theory of systematic planning and work is adopted by the staff members who improve their performance.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Teaching faculty is appointed by following the rules and regulations of the Government of Maharashtra and S. P. Pune University, Pune. Non-teaching staff is also appointed in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Government of Maharashtra and S. P. Pune University, Pune. Temporary teaching staff is appointed by the management council of the college at local level on ad-hoc basis. In this procedure of selection also college appoints qualified staff and knowledgeable teachers. In this recruitment the subject experts recommend the candidate and the same candidate is selected.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

Department of Physics, Chemistry and Geography have undertaken a joint programme in facilitating the local farmers. These departments share their knowledge regarding environmental changes, weather forecast, soil testing and horticulture with the local farmers.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

- For this we form the Admission Committees for counselling the student for their Admission.
- The college started online admissions to all classes from this academic year. The college offers admissions to some courses on first-come-first-serve basis. Such admission can be completed within half an hour by the students. Admission committee recommends the students who are eligible for admission; such students go for direct admission.
- For some courses like M. Sc. Physics and M.Sc. Chemistry & S.Y.B.A. admissions are given on merit basis as per rules and regulations of S. P. Pune University, Pune. In this admission process, the rules of reservations are strictly followed.
- Poor and needy students are offered admission without charging any fees. The college bears their fees and help them in taking higher education.

- 6.11 Activities and support from the Alumni Association
 - N.C.C. cadets who are passed out from college, visit college at regular interval of time and guide our students in preparing for military, para-military and police services.
 - Mr. Sunil Bora, Mr. Sudhir Daga, Mr. Mukund Bhutada, Mr. Pankaj Lodha, Mr. Amit Shah help poor and needy students in terms of giving them uniforms, bus fares, and admission fees on their own level informally. But now college has decided to register Alumni Association formally and arrange all activities and support through that association.
 - The college provided medical aid to Mali Sandip Dilip in terms of medical expenses. The amount is 5000.
- 6.12 Activities and support from the Parent Teacher Association
 - The meetings of Parent-Teacher Association are held regularly in the college. In these meetings the awareness is created among the parents and students about stress management, the uses and abuses of mobile, commuting problems and solutions as well as to improve the academic performance of their wards.
 - As per the suggestion given by the parents, the college provided a bus for the transportation of girl students on no loss-no profit basis.

6.13 Development programmes for support staff

- The college runs co-operative consumer store for all the staff members and the students. Through this store, the staff and students receive stationery material and consumable items on the basis of no profit-no loss.
- The college also organized health check-up camp for non-teaching staff. Computer training programme was organized for non teaching staff.
- The college also organised workshop for teaching and non- teaching staff on stress management.

6.14 Initiatives taken by the institution to make the campus eco-friendly

- The college installed 10kWp Solar Energy Plant which cost around 5.5 lakhs.
- The college initiated the use of fabric carry bags instead of plastic carry bags.
- Students of our college planted medicinal plants in the botanical garden.
- A lecture on 'Water Conservation' was organized in the college.
- NSS volunteers and NCC cadets planted many trees in college premises to make the campus ecofriendly.

 - Department of Physics published a special issue- Peered reviewed International Research Journal "Science & Engineering" of National Conference on Renewable energy & Environment in January 2018. [UGC Approved Journal No. 63628, ISSN:2322-0015, SJIF Impact factor: 4.13]
 - A one day college financed International conference on the theme of "Role of Skill Development for Youth Empowerment and Nation Building" was organized on 25th February 2018. The conference was inaugurated by Dr.Maeen Abdulwali Mohammed, from Sana University, Yemen. Dr. Wadah Ahmed and Prof.Iqbal Shaikh of Sana University, Yemen, Dr.S.M.Kote, Dr.Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad were the resource persons for the conference. .7 faculties from abroad and 59 faculties from various institutions all over the nation and 127 students actively participated in the same.
 - One day workshop on "Programming in C" was organized on 15th Feb 2018. Prof. Manojkumar S. Langote, HOD of MCA department, PIRENS Technical campus was the resource person for the same.
 - Department of English of K.J.Somaiya College ,Kopargaon organized two day state level conference titled, 'Translation on Globalization: Perspectives in Humanities, Science and Commerce' on 12th and 13th January ,2018. The conference was well attended by eminent academicians, renowned poets and writers, research scholars, professors and students from reputed educational institutes. The objectives behind this conference was to explore various themes and major concepts of translation in the globalised world, as an outcomes,34 research papers have been published in the UGC approved journal Research Journey(Multi-desciplinary International –Research Journal)-Special Issues XXXI.
 - Department of Economics conducted state level conference on 'Economical Management of Water: Need and Significance'. In this conference special issue of 'Sanshodan Samiksha'-ISSN: 2278-9308 with impact factor 3.20, a monthly Peer Reviewed International Research Journal, was published which contained 40 full length papers.
 - IQAC motivated all teachers to publish research papers in reputed Journals with ISSN, as a result **61** papers were published in National and International Journals. In order to conduct Academic Audit, a Core Committee, comprising the Principal, IQAC Coordinator and Management Representative of ISO were constituted. The academic audit, Green Audit, Energy Audit, and Surveillance Audit of ISO 9001:2015 was held in first week of November 2016.
 - 01- National conference, 02- State Level Conference and 02 in-house National Level workshops on Robotics and Android System Development (2-Days each) and 03 in-house seminars were organized. It was possible because of the encouragement given to the Departments.
 - Training and Placement Cell in association with National Skill Development Council organized one month training programme for the final year students in all faculties in the sectors of Logistics, Retail and Beauty and wellness in March 2017.

• The IQAC has proposed to increase the number of Smart Class Rooms.

ATR:The college increased number of Smart Class Rooms and LCD Projectors allotted to various departments to enhance ICT base education.

• The IQAC proposed to start more Research Center in the college.

ATR:According to IQAC guidelines, the Department of Chemistry and Political Science are in the process of starting of M.Phil. and Ph.D. research centres.

The IQAC proposes to start PG in Zoology

ATR: As per IQAC suggestion, College submitted the proposal for starting PG in Zoology to the Govt. of Maharashtra and S.P.Pune University and the permission has been given by both the authorities. The course will start soon.

• The IQAC proposed to increase the divisions of M.Sc. Physics and Chemistry.

ATR:As per IQAC suggestion, College submitted the proposal for getting one more divisions to each Physics and Chemistry to the Govt. of Maharashtra and S.P.Pune University and the permission has been given by both the authorities. The additional divisions will start soon.

• The IQAC proposed to establish Intellectual Property Rights Cell.

ATR:Intellectual Property Right (IPR) Cell was established in the department of Commerce with the objective of creating awareness about various intellectual properties such as trademarks, patents, copyrights etc. among the students.

The college intends to increase the number of organization and participation in conferences, seminars and workshops.

ATR: The number of organization and participation in conferences, seminars and workshops has been increased.

 The IQAC proposed to organise One day workshop on "Programming in C" in Computer Science department

ATR:One day workshop on "**Programming in C**" was organized on 15th Feb 2018. Prof. Manojkumar S. Langote, HOD of MCA department, PIRENS Technical campus was the resource person for the same.



Annexure- II: An analysis of the feedback of the year: 2017-18

FEEDBACK ANALYSIS: 2017-18

The College aims to offer the best possible environment and learning experience to encourage students to perform to their full potential.

Students play a critical part in the evaluation, development and enhancement of the quality of this learning experience. Feedback from students allows the College to evaluate how its service provision is viewed by its most important group of stakeholders, namely its students. The feedback is also obtained from parents and alumni at the time of meeting with them. The random sampling method is used for the collection of feedback.

Students are invited and given feedback forms on an anonymous basis, towards the end of semester / terms. This process occurs on a twice-yearly basis: towards the end of the first semester, in December, and towards the end of the second Semester, in April. In each case, feedback is collected after students have been assessed. The feedback of parents and alumni is also taken at the time of meeting with them.

Student's feedback-

- According to 95% students, all teachers have successfully completed their syllabus.
- ➤ Some of the students (20%) suggested that Teaching Learning Process should be incorporated with the awareness of environmental aspects.
- ➤ 4% students suggested that some teachers should create interest about syllabus in classroom.

The said feedback is analyzed very minutely by feedback committee and the 'Action Taken Report'-ATR is prepared on it.

- ➤ The feedback of academic year 2017-18 is analyzed minutely by Feedback Committee which gives following suggestions to the college. They are as follows:
 - More rooms be created in Ladies Hostel for accommodation.
 - Internet facility be given in library and 4G wi-fi facility be given in college campus.
 - Seating capacity of reading room in library should be increased.
 - Alumni and Parents have expressed their desire that college should give preference to professional and technical education.
 - There should be more research centres.
 - Alumni Association should be registered.
 - Merit based educational facilities to economically weaker students should be enhanced.

All the above cited suggestions are discussed in IQAC meeting and are complied by the college at the end of this year.

<u>Title of the Practice</u>: <u>Save the Nature</u>: <u>Conservation and Utilization of Natural Resources</u>

When sun rises everything looks bright orange and then yellowish. In the evening when sun sets, it again becomes dark, orange and then light dark.

The nature has everything for us but we do not have anything for it even we are destroying its property day by day to just fulfil our selfish wishes. In the modern technological world lots of inventions are getting launched daily without its advantage and disadvantage to the nature. It is our responsibility to save the declining assets of our nature to make possible the existence of life forever on the earth. If we do not take any step towards nature conservation, we are keeping our future generations at danger. We should understand its worth, value and try to maintain its natural shape.

1. Goals:

- To carry out Green Audit in securing the environment and cut down the threats posed to human health.
- To determine ways to reduce energy consumption per unit of product output or to lower operating costs.
- To meet the increasing demand of water and supplement laboratories water needs.
- To reduce soil erosion and increase the natural beauty of the landscape and land rehabilitation.
- To create awareness among the students about safe practices of plastic waste management and run a campaign with the help of other agencies who are involved in plastic waste management programs.
- To develop awareness among students about the nature and causes of energy related challenges being faced by humankind.
- To make the students aware of various types of non-renewable and renewable sources of energy.
- To motivate and prepare the students to make efforts towards development and implementation of alternative strategies to face various challenges faced by energy sector.
- To develop functional values and attitudes in the students towards harnessing of renewable energy sources.
- To create the awareness among society in general and students in particular about water pollution and epidemic diseases due to it.
- To conserve and beautify the Godavari River bank.

2. The Context:

- Education is one of the most effective means for providing solutions to the problems faced by the society. Renewable energy education, in essence, is the treatment of various topics and issues related to renewable energy resources and technologies as an independent subject. The broad objectives of renewable energy education pertain to providing functional knowledge and understanding of facts, concepts, principles and technologies for harnessing of renewable sources of energy. Therefore, depending upon its level, the role of a renewable energy education programme should be educative, informative, investigative and imaginative. Renewable energy education and more broadly the energy education has to have the entire population as its target audience.
- ➤ The intention of organizing Green Audit is to upgrade the environment condition in and around the institutes, colleges, companies and other organizations. It is carried out with the aid of performing tasks like waste management, energy saving and others to turn into a better environmental friendly institute.
- The Energy Audit would give a positive orientation to the energy cost reduction, preventive maintenance and quality control programmes which are vital for production and utility activities. Such an audit programme will help to keep focus on variations which occur in the energy costs, availability and reliability of supply of energy, decide on appropriate energy mix, identify energy conservation technologies, retrofit for energy conservation equipment etc.
- Renewable energy education programmes should be efficient and economic (maximum number of people educated within available financial resources) besides being effective in achieving the desired objectives. To the extent possible, the university level teaching/training programmes on renewable energy education in particular and all other initiatives, in general, must ensure employment/self employment to the students upon successful completion.
- Plastic is now an integral part of the everyday activity of human life and one cannot rule out the advantages of plastic but the disadvantages can be reduced to some extent if certain tips to deal with plastic waste are followed and these are:
- ➤ Prohibition on manufacturing/selling of certain plastic material/bags: Some governments in the developed and developing countries has prohibited the manufacture and selling of plastic bags or material that contains more than the standard prescribed microns of plastic. By this way, the excessive dependence on plastic has been controlled to some extent.

Annual Quality Assurance Report: 2017-18

- ➤ Using paper bags and other cloth materials as shopping bags for a customer can be useful. It is suggested to use paper bags and bags made with cloth material such as jute, cotton etc while going for shopping or for purchasing grocery items.
- ➤ In this way, we as individuals can rely less on the plastic bags while going on a shopping spree.
- ➤ Thus the use of plastics can be controlled and we can also give a lending heart for an effective waste management system.
- ➤ One of the biggest outputs of the 'Ganesh Chaturthi' festival is the tonnes of 'nirmalya' the offerings collected during the immersion. These offerings are made of several items: flower garlands, fruits, coconuts, spices, honey and camphor. While most of the offerings themselves are made of natural items, they come wrapped in plastic bags, plastic boxes or glass bottles.
- Traditionally, these items were meant to be immersed with the Ganesh idols, as an offering back to nature. However, since immersion of these on large scale is bound to cause problems, the NSS volunteers of our college has successfully convinced devotees to deposit their 'nirmalya' bags in a trolley near the ghats. Yet, the fact that non biodegradable materials such as plastic or thermocol accompany the offerings, makes it necessary to appropriately manage the 'nirmalya' collected. From 2009, NSS Volunteers including NCC Cadets and Nagar Parishad Kopargaon, came together to take this process one step forward.
- The NSS volunteers will collect the nirmalya bags and make sure all the contents of the bags are correctly separated into biodegradable and non biodegradable substances. Food items such as fruits and coconuts are taken home by the women or distributed to the poor. The bulk of the flowers collected will be composted by the Kopargaon Nagar Parishad.
- ➤ This project has received the approval and support of both the Kopargaon Nagar Parishad as well as the authorities of Kopargaon Taluka Education Society.

3. The Practice:

- At the beginning of the year IQAC gave guidelines to all the departments to conduct the
 activities in concern with conservation of nature and utilization of natural resources.
 Accordingly many departments planned their activities in tune with the guidelines given
 by IQAC.
- The Department of Physics organized "National Conference on Renewable Energy and Environment" on 19th & 20th January 2018.
- Department of Physics published a special issue- Peered reviewed International Research
 Journal "Science & Engineering" of National Conference on Renewable energy &

- Environment in January 2018. [UGC Approved Journal No. 63628, ISSN:2322-0015, SJIF Impact factor: 4.13]
- 08 Recourse Persons delivered lectures on different valuable topics related to "Renewable Energy & Environment". 39 faculty members & 17 students belong to different university & colleges of Maharashtra state participated in the National conference. Also 11 participants from all India & 81 students from our college participated in this conference. This conference was very fruitful for all the faculty members and student participants regarding "Renewable Energy & Environment"
- The college has developed the best mechanism to harvest the rain water. Rain water storage tank of 150000 litres has built-up and the rain water goes in it from the roof of Gymkhana and science building through separate pipeline.
- One of the best eco-friendly practices is that of solar energy. The college has established Street Solar Light of approximate Rs.150000.00. This gives light all over campus and saves the electricity bill of the worth of Rs. 25000 per year. The Boys and Girls Hostel are well-equipped with solar water heater facility.
- The College has developed mechanism to save the electricity by going for energy audit. It has saved our electricity tremendously.
- The college has completed Green audit of the campus and identified some rare species of the plants which are being taken care of.
- Under the motto 'Clean College, Green College', the institute has developed plastic garbage management mechanism.
- 'River Godavari Cleaning Campaign' is undertaken as a long term project. Also, NSS volunteers help to collect 'Niramalya' (waste material) during 'Ganpati Idol Immersion' Programme nearby Godavari River during every year.
- Plastic material is not used on campus by all the stake holders of the institute. The college initiated the use of fabric carry bags instead of plastic carry bags.
- A lecture on 'Rain Water Harvesting' was organized in the college.
- Under the motto 'Go Green & Plant a Tree', NSS volunteers and NCC cadets planted
 many trees in college premises to make the campus eco-friendly. Also, Tree plantation
 project at the bank of the Godavari River is also undertaken by college. Last year trees were
 guarded with steel grills. Students of our college planted medicinal plants in the botanical
 garden.

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- The college started production of vermicompost by using dry leaves and waste material collected on the premises.
- The students of department of Botany planted rare plants in nursery.
- The college developed three layered filtration plant for the drainage water so that the filtered water enters into the Godavari River.

4. Evidence of Success:

- N.S.S. Unit has worked consistently towards eco-friendly agenda of the college. This unit
 has worked in beautify the Godavari river and tree plantation. As a result, S. P. Pune
 University has recognized our NSS Unit as a best unit in Ahmednagar District and NSS
 Programme Officer as a best Programme Officer in Ahmednagar District.
- The activity of 'Niramalya' during 'Ganpati Idol Immersion' was appreciated by Kopargaon Nagar Parishad and Police Station Kopargaon by felicitating & awarding a Certificate of Appreciation.
- Our college has strictly prohibited the usage of plastic carry bags and had gone for ecofriendly fabric bags.
- The college has built-up a large water storage tank to collect rain water from roof of building and said rain water is being used for distilled water in Chemistry Laboratories and other purposes.
- The college has installed solar street light panels in the premises and it helps to reduce electric energy consumption.

5. Problems encountered and resources required:

- Kopargaon region comes under rain shadow zone and hence water scarcity is the permanent problem. It hampers the nurturing of trees planted.
- It is difficult to change the age-old habits of human beings. So, we are taking serious efforts to give up these habits such as use of plastics and throwing garbage in the river.

6. **Notes:**

The collection of **rainwater** from the roofs of buildings can easily take place within our cities and towns, not just in India. All that is necessary to capture this water is to direct the flow of rainwater from roof gutters to a rainwater storage tank. By doing this, water can be collected and used for various uses. It is a technique of increasing the recharge of groundwater by storing rainwater locally, through roof water harvesting, refilling of dug wells, recharging of hand pumps, construction of percolation pits, trenches around fields and bunds or dams on small rivulets.

The Solar Energy a clean renewable resource with zero emission has got tremendous potential of energy which can be harnessed using a variety of devices. With recent developments, solar energy systems are easily available for industrial and domestic use with the added advantage of minimum maintenance. Solar energy could be made financially viable with government tax incentives and rebates. Most of the developed countries are switching over to solar energy as one of the prime renewable energy source. The current architectural designs make provision for photovoltaic cells and necessary circuitry while making building plans. The National Solar Mission is a major initiative of the Government of India and State Governments to promote ecologically sustainable growth while addressing India's energy security challenge. It will also constitute a major contribution by India to the global effort to meet the challenges of climate change. The objective of the National Solar Mission is to establish India as a global leader in solar energy, by creating the policy conditions for its diffusion across the country as quickly as possible. The immediate aim of the Mission is to focus on setting up an enabling environment for solar technology penetration in the country both at a centralized and decentralized level. The National Action Plan on Climate Change also points out: "India is a tropical country, where sunshine is available for longer hours per day and in great intensity. Solar energy, therefore, has great potential as future energy source. It also has the advantage of permitting the decentralized distribution of energy, thereby empowering people at the grassroots level".

The Energy Audit would give a positive orientation to the energy cost reduction, preventive maintenance and quality control programmes which are vital for production and utility activities. Such an audit programme will help to keep focus on variations which occur in the energy costs, availability and reliability of supply of energy, decide on appropriate energy mix, identify energy conservation technologies, retrofit for energy conservation equipment etc.

The Green audit was initiated with the beginning of 1970s with the motive of inspecting the work conducted within the organizations whose exercises can cause risk to the health of inhabitants and the environment. It exposes the authenticity of the proclamations made by multinational companies, armies and national governments with the concern of health issues as the consequences of environmental pollution. It is the duty of organizations to carry out the Green Audits of their ongoing processes for various reasons such as; to make sure whether they are performing in accordance with relevant rules and regulations, to improve the procedures and ability of materials, to analyze the potential duties and to determine a way which can lower the cost and add to the revenue. Through Green Audit, one gets a direction as how to improve the condition of

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environment and there are various factors that have determined the growth of carrying out Green Audit. In general, Audit is the translation of conservation ideas into realities, by lending technically feasible solutions with economic and other organizational considerations within a specified time frame.

Best Practice No.-II:

1. Title of the Practice: Cyber Security: Problems and Solutions

Cyber crime is one of the fastest growing areas of crime. More and more criminals are exploiting the speed, convenience and anonymity that modern technologies offer in order to commit a diverse range of criminal activities. These includes attacks against computer data and systems, identity theft, the distribution of child sexual abuse images, internet auction fraud, the penetration of online financial services as well as the deployment of viruses and phishing. The global nature of the Internet has allowed criminals to commit almost any illegal activity anywhere in the world, making it essential for all countries to adapt their domestic offline controls to cover crimes carried out in cyber world. The maximum use of internet through smart phones poses a serious threat to national and international security.

2. Goals:

The development goals and the role of Cyber crime: Awareness and Security are as follows:

- 1) To make students and society familiar with the concept of 'Cybercrime'.
- 2) To know the changing nature of cyber crime.
- 3) To create awareness about cyber crime.
- 4) To provide information about career opportunities in cyber security.

3. The Context:

Today the internet allows users to gather, store, process and transfer vast amount of data, including proprietary and sensitive business, transactional and personal data. At the same time the populations even at Tehsil level rely more and more on such capabilities. The population includes businessman and the consumers. Cyber security threats evolve as security threats and continue to plague the internet economy. The constantly evolving nature of threats and vulnerabilities affects individual firms and their customers as well as national security channel; so sharing responsibility to protect cyber security is becoming more important. Lacks of unprotected computers are connected to internet, which means security deficiencies in a limited number of systems can be exploited to launch cyber attacks on other systems.

Tehsil place are safe for the hackers, social network attackers and for cyber criminal groups. The security personals focus their attention towards metro cities and hence it takes time to detect the cyber crime.

The college expects a positive initiative from the society if the students are given proper education regarding cyber security and safeguard the data of every organization, individual by creating value based system and provision the provision of Information Technology Act.

3. The Practice:

The students of first year are informed about the limited use of social media in the campus and the society. They are informed about the Information Technology Act through the display of posters, notice and hoardings. The lectures of eminent professionals from IT sector are organized for the students every year. The Department of Computer Applications and Computer Science jointly organize a campaign throughout the year for achieving the above goals and secure the society.

4. Evidence of Success:

This year college decided to bring a special issue of college annual magazine on social media and online games at the beginning of the year. Accordingly all the activities were planned and students were motivated to write on social media from all angles. This activity was planned in tune with this best practice to spread awareness among the students about cyber security in social media. At the end of the year it was noticed that students were fully aware of cyber security and its pros and cons. They wrote extensively on social media and its uses and abuses, online games, uses and misuses of internet. All the articles written by students and faculty members have been incorporated in Godatarang, our college annual magazine.

Several Non Government Organizations, Cyber cafes, IT Professionals from Pune, Aurangabad, Nasik, and Mumbai are invited to share their experiences with the students and masses directly. The Practical approach is also maintained for the same. The college has signed MoU with the Intelligent Quotient Security System, Pune for the same.

The college distributes the leaflets containing the information about punishment for various cyber crimes and circulates the same in the Tehsil periodically.

The college organizes a workshop for the police personnel's in the district which is headed by the Superintendent of Cyber Cell every year.

The teachers and the students in post graduate department of Computer Applications visit various schools, colleges, and private coaching classes to deliver the lecture and create the awareness about cyber security.

The college has prepared a small booklet containing the IT Act and its provisions. This booklet is issued to the libraries of various colleges at free of cost.

The students with their faculty members of various streams participate in the various workshops, seminars and symposiums on the theme of Cyber Security.

Techno-Fest is one of the most popular events in the college in which students of various faculties participate in the events of technology and computer programming. It includes paper presentation as one of the compulsory activity for every participant.

This activity of college has been appreciated by the newspapers, renowned personalities, social workers in the Tehsil and the police department. The college receives several requests from the local associations in the vicinity to deliver the lecture or organize an exhibition on the issue of cyber security.

5. Problems encountered and resources required:

Kopargaon Taluka is situated at around 100 kms from the district places of Ahmednagar, Aurangabad and Nasik. It has 4 international schools, Engineering College and around 5 colleges imparting traditional and professional courses. The students in these colleges have regular contacts with the cities in metros or at district levels. The nuisance values regarding cyber are easy to spread in spite of continuous counselling. There is no cyber cell with the government officials of Kopargaon Tehsil which also creates a problem for us to communicate with the office bearers for counselling.

The college needs a strong support in the form of expert guidance from the Government cyber cell and also economic support to continue with the activity.

6. **Notes:**

Cyber is prefix derived from a Greek adjective 'cybernetic' which means skilled in steering or skilled in governing. Cybernetic also means control of speech and functional process. Cyber power is a new power to every individual, group, society and nation. Today's cyber world is full of ICT devices or gadgets. The security of all the sorted data, messages, communication, identity, password, PIN's, personal information is termed as cyber security. The Do's and Don'ts of cyber security need to be promoted to the early users of internet. Privacy and data theft are today the top security issues that organizations need to focus in coming years. Cyber espionage and social networking attacks will be the trend to watch together with other more traditional threats. It also has the effects on human life. The strength of health disaster and virtual reality is also increasing, cyber games, messaging, pornography, chatting, videos and music downloads are occupying most of our time and educating the masses become more necessary in the field of cyber education.
